Apart from the modern improvement of kiln drying, the Baltic Pine floorboard hasn't changed for 150 years.

Still the same thickness, still the same width; the offset classic tongue and groove profile provides for multiple sanding processes over the floor's life and fits perfectly into a traditional home, yet is equally at home with contemporary designs.

Disadvantages, does and do not's .

Nordic softwoods are (Janka hardness 380 for Whitewood or 540 for Redwood) the timber will bruise and mark in high wear areas. Often in Northern hemisphere countries, societies have a 'shows off' culture indoors. This is ideal to protect your floor from damage or bruising.

Avoid two pack polyurethane coatings that may bond the tongue and groove joints to becomes bonded together. Boards must be free to expand and contract with climatic conditions. Boards bonded by polyurethane may crack or split.

Care should be taken where intense direct sunlight shines on exposed floors. We recommend shade or blinds be used during periods of extreme sunlight or high temperatures. Air conditioning and heating systems change the ambient moisture content of the air and will accentuate the movement of the boards.
